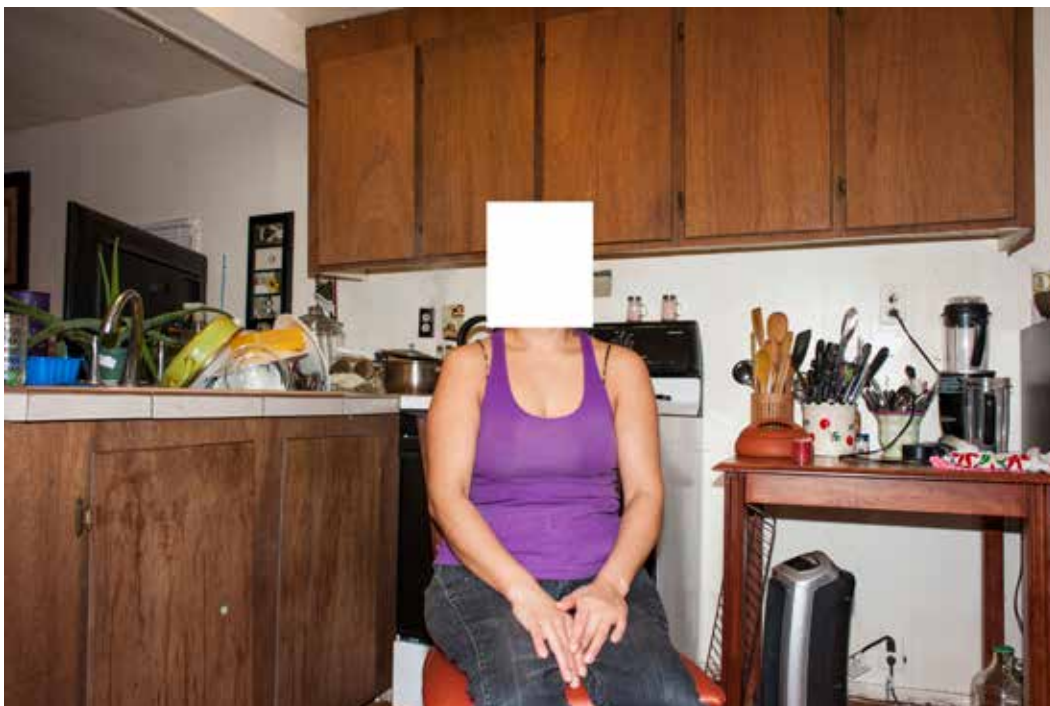


To Live More Free

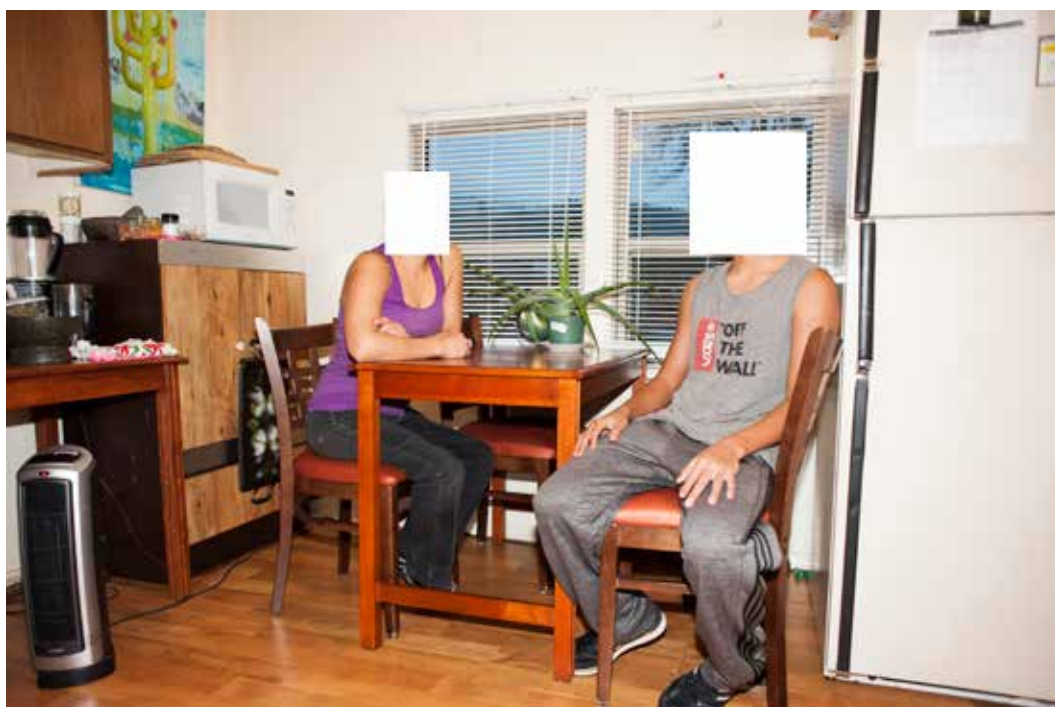
Southern Oregonians describe the challenges and fears of working while being undocumented.

Fabiola works two jobs and worries that deportation might separate her from her son.



“The situation in Mexico was really bad. I couldn’t have a good job. I thought I wasn’t going to be able to pay for a house for my baby and I. . . [My aunt] said come before my baby was born and he will have a better future, better opportunity.”

“I make payments to [the previous owner of my home]. It is still in her name because . . . I was not able to get a loan from the bank. I tried it before but they denied it because I don’t have a social security.”





"I am worried about deportation because I don't know what is going to happen with my son. . . . He needs me. He definitely needs me. I would like to live more free, go everywhere, do more and more."
